

Flow of Determining Evacuation Action


To prepare for typhoons and heavy rain, check the "Flow of Determining Evacuation Action" along with the hazard map.

Know and Prepare	Know the disaster risk in your residential area	[Example] ● Residential area: sediment disaster warning zones, zones expected to experience flooding and collapse of structures, zones expected to be inundated by XX meters of water ● Evacuation center: XX Elementary School ● Travel time: 30 minutes ● Travel method: Walking ● When to start evacuation: When evacuation for the elderly, etc., is issued ● Information sources: TV and radio news, Kizugawa City website, city disaster prevention information emails, etc. ● [Warning Level 3] Must evacuate for when evacuations for the elderly, etc., are announced ● Evacuate when the water level of XX River exceeds XX meters, etc.

	Check details of the warning, etc., and determine necessary action	
	Check how to gather information before and after a disaster	
	Event triggering evacuation ※Decide the timing of your evacuation in advance.	

Situation	Warning level	Your action
Risk of worsening weather conditions	Level 1 Early advisory information (issued by the Japan Meteorological Agency)	[Example] ● Check the weather forecast on TV or the internet ● Check your emergency supplies
Worsening weather conditions	Level 2 Heavy rain and flood advisory (issued by the Japan Meteorological Agency)	● Reconfirm evacuation centers and transportation methods ● Make sure your mobile phones or smartphones are charged ● Fill up your car with fuel
Risk of disaster occurrence	Level 3 Evacuation of the elderly, etc. (ordered by the city)	● Inform distant family and friends that you are evacuating ● Start evacuating to evacuation centers
High risk of disaster occurrence	Level 4 Evacuation instruction (ordered by the city)	● Finish your evacuation ● Check the latest conditions on TV, radio, mobile phone, smartphone, etc.
Disaster has occurred or is imminent	Level 5 Emergency safety measures (ordered by the city)	● Immediately evacuate to the safe place XX. However, if evacuation is dangerous, move to the second floor of your building or a room away from cliffs.
