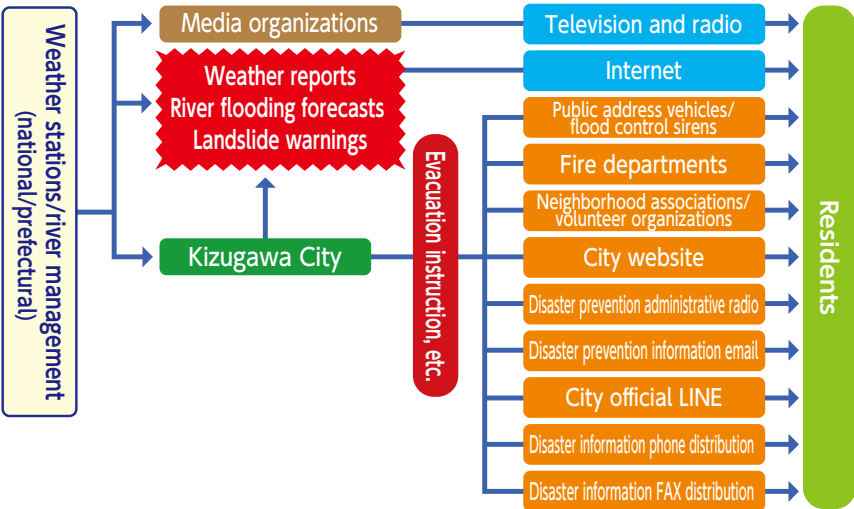
Messages from City Hall and urgency of action to be taken

Kizugawa City has categorized disaster evacuation information into five levels as the national and prefectural governments announce disaster prevention weather information.

Note 1: Alert Level 5 is not always issued for reasons such as the fact that Kizugawa City cannot reliably grasp the situation of the disaster.  
Note 2: Evacuation orders will be issued at the timing of previous evacuation advisories.  
Note 3: Alert Level 3 is a time when people other than the elderly begin to refrain from their usual activities, prepare for evacuation, and voluntarily evacuate if they feel unsafe.

Designated emergency evacuation locations

The city designates locations such as the grounds of elementary and junior high schools, parks, parking lots, and similar as temporary points of evacuation. They are categorized according to the type of disaster, so that residents may quickly escape danger and protect their lives in the event that such a disaster occurs or is likely to occur.

Supported evacuation centers

These are evacuation centers for persons requiring special attention during the evacuation period, such as the elderly and physically impaired. Decisions on who can be accommodated at these facilities are made before admission. Therefore, such persons should first proceed to a standard evacuation center.

※ The target area for each designated evacuation center is based on the elementary school district. However, depending on the ease of evacuation from your place of residence and the situation of the disaster, it may be preferable to evacuate to other evacuation centers.

Designated evacuation centers

These centers are designated by the city to provide accommodation for a certain period of time to residents who have evacuated and are waiting until the danger passes. Those who cannot return to their homes due to damage inflicted by the disaster will also stay over a period of time.

Community Evacuation Centers

There are 24 temporary evacuation centers, including community centers and meeting halls, which are established and operated by the local community.
